

"Do not let the things of the world blur your vision of the Word." A Blurred Vision

Six months went by after my cataract surgery. Things began to be blurry. I thought the problem was my new glasses. However, it kept getting worse. I soon could not read a book, look at words on the computer or drive safely. It got so bad that I saw someone putting a large sign up to sell something for Mother's Day. I thought the sign read Fireworks, instead of Flowers. At the doctor's office, I could not read below the third of the largest line. He told me that I needed to wear a patch over my bad eye so the good one would not try to compensate until they can correct the problem. I then got an infection in that eye, so the laser treatment was delayed for several weeks. During that extended time, I got used to the blurred vision of the world. It took 72 laser shots to clear it.

"When you have cataract surgery, your ophthalmologist removes your eye's cloudy lens. They replace it with a clear, artificial intraocular lens (IOL). The IOL is held in place in the eye's natural lens capsule. Weeks, months or years later, this capsule can become cloudy or wrinkled, causing blurry vision. This is called a posterior capsule opacification (PCO). It's also sometimes called a "secondary cataract" or "scar tissue." With posterior capsulotomy, a laser is used to make an opening in the cloudy capsule. This allows light to pass through again for clear vision."¹

Most people do not have a blurred vision of the world, but they do have a blurred vision of the Word. Jesus wanted to know what type of vision people had of Him. So, He asked His disciples; "Who do men say that I am?" Let's see how clear your spiritual vision is:

Who do you say Jesus is? Why did Jesus die on the cross? Is the Bible the inspired Word of God? Is there life after death? Does God answer prayers? Are you a sinner? Is mankind condemned to hell? Do you know you are going to heaven? Is there more than one way to heaven? Can you lose your salvation?

You may have been taught the truth, but something happened. and you no longer see clearly. Cover that thought, that teaching, that person and seek good counsel, church and the Word.
