When my wife arrived, they told her that I could not be found. They then shocked her by saying that I was having heart surgery. They placed a temporary pacemaker into my chest to keep me alive. They then upgraded it to a specialized one which just arrived in York and was FDA approved just weeks before. (I think just for me.)

That day, on that road, could have been my last. If my wife would of drive me in, it would have been my death road. I truly believed that I was minutes away from no longer living and I did not have a chance to say good bye to my family and friends. But I was at peace and even making those around me laugh. I know I was ready to meet my Maker and I know where I would spend eternity. But the Lord said “not yet” and kept me here.

We may not be on Death Row. We may not currently have a life threatening issue. However, the day we were born, we all started speeding down that Death Road. Each day, it gets a little closer. 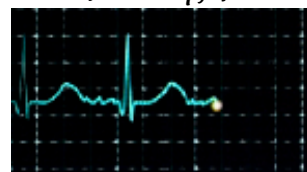
