The other month I went to the eye doctor. He covered my left eye and asked me to read the letters. I said, “Doctor, there is something wrong with your electronic chart. I cannot even read the top letter.” Without changing anything, he covered my other eye. I could read the fourth line down. He replied, “It is not my charts. It is your eye. You have a cataract.” I was totally surprised. I had to agree that I had a problem, ask for help and sign my name for surgery.

I was scared to death. They had to knock me out that day. I do not remember anything but I was told that my cataract was very hard. I had a black eye for two weeks. However, it was successful. The Doctor was amazed that I now have 20/20 vision. I never knew I could not see things clearly.

“A cataract is a clouding of the lens in the eye which leads to a decrease in vision. Cataracts often develop slowly and can affect one or both eyes. Symptoms may include faded colors, blurry vision, halos around light, trouble with bright lights, and trouble seeing at night. This may result in trouble driving, reading, or recognizing faces. Cataracts cause half of all cases of blindness and 33% of visual impairment worldwide. More than half the people in the United States had cataracts by the age of 80. en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Cataract
