In the middle of the night, we got a phone call that her Father was rushed to the hospital with a stroke. We were to come home immediately. We did not make it home in time before he died. We did not know that when we said goodbye for our trip, that it was the last time we would see him alive. (My wife has gone to the Outer Banks three times and each time one of the parents of the vacation party died.)

Some deaths, like our recent close friend, come expectedly. He had been battling cancer for some time. The doctors finally said, "We can do nothing more. You only have a few weeks to live." He was my wife's youth leader, when she was a teen, and like a second father to her for the next 50 years. They were our family's closest friends. My wife visited him in those last few days. He was actually the one who cheered her and my mother-in-law up. He was a Father, Friend, Funny, and Faithful even in his last days on earth. His funeral was the largest I ever attended.

No matter how rich or important you are, or your nationality, or the color of your skin, or your religious beliefs, or what you did for humanity or how healthy you are, you will one day stop living on this earth. Each second that goes by you get closer to that time. No one can deny or stop this fact. Very few of us will know when, how and where.

With this certainty of death, most of us are prepared with a Will, "Life Insurance" and some have their own burial preparations. But, so strange that many of these same people have no interest, thoughts or even preparations about what happens to them after death. How can they be certain there is no life after death, no heaven or hell, and no judgement? If we who believe the Bible are right and those who deny it are wrong, then they are in big trouble at death. On the other hand, if we are wrong in our belief, what do we lose when we die? Nothing. We still had a wonderful life on earth.
