Vacation

Giving myself more time to think, I responded, "You tell me your answer first." She began with Scotland, Alaska, New England, Frankenmuth Michigan, Disney World, and her list continued on and on. It was then my turn. The only thing I could think of was Star Wars at Disney. I am not much of a vacation person. In my whole life, I only took a few weeklong vacations.

Well, God forced me to rest again, for a few days. Less than a month after vacation, my pacemaker had to be replaced. I wore the battery out three years sooner then it was to last. Will I ever slow down?

On the seventh day of creation, God made it a day of rest. Exodus 23:12. Not because He needed it but because we needed it Mark 2:27. It is even a part of the Ten Commandments Exodus 20:5-9. The discussion here is not going to be which day is the Sabbath. nor what you can and cannot do on that day. The application is for a day of worship, rest, and fellowship. God also gave us a third of each day, the night to rest, sleep, and recharge. PS 4:8
